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















Wylie EDC Manufacturing Day







Whereas, Manufacturing Day is a celebration of modern manufacturing designed to inspire the next generation to make a difference through manufacturing, communicate that the next generation is vital to successful manufacturing, and demonstrate the opportunity, creativity, possibility, and accomplishment that accompany a career in manufacturing; and

Whereas, throughout history, manufacturing has played a significant role in creating the foundation for national, state, and local economies; and

Whereas, Texas currently has nearly 850,000 direct manufacturing jobs and over 2 million additional jobs indirectly created or supported by manufacturers; and

Whereas, Wylie, with 49 manufacturing businesses, \$268,000,000 in annual manufacturing revenue, and 2,100 manufacturing jobs, represents over 11% of the manufacturing jobs in Collin County, despite representing 5% of the population; and

Whereas, the City of Wylie and the Wylie Economic Development Corporation are working in partnership with local manufacturing concerns and the Wylie Independent School District to enlighten our young citizens as to the many career opportunities that exist in the manufacturing world; and

Whereas, Oct. 4, 2019, will mark the launch of a series of programs focused upon manufacturing education.




