What is Vocational Rehabilitation?

- The Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) program helps people with disabilities prepare for, enter, engage in, or advance in competitive employment.
- The program also helps businesses and employers recruit, retain and accommodate employees with disabilities.

Transition Services

Transition Services are a subset of Vocational Rehabilitation Services for those individuals aged 14-22.

In most cases, the services provided to transition students fall into one of these 5 Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) categories:

- Career Exploration
- Work-Based Learning
- Counseling on Post-Secondary
- Job Readiness
- Self-Advocacy

TEA/TWC Memorandum of Understanding

Est. 2015 Senate Bill 208 84th Legislature

- Increase coordination to prepare students with disabilities for postsecondary education and/or competitive integrated employment.
- Improve transition planning between VR/ LEAs for student Individualized Education Program.
- Establish mechanism to identify areas in Texas with greatest need for transition services.
- Ensure VR (access) staff can attend Admission, Review, Dismissal committee meetings.
- Identify parties' roles and responsibilities.
- Strengthen relationships between state agency's TEA/ TWC/ ESC/ LEAs/ Higher Education entities and businesses to facilitate successful outcomes for students with disabilities.

Persons with a Disability: Labor Force Characteristics Summary

- Across all age groups, persons with disabilities were much less likely to be employed than those with no disabilities.
- Across all educational attainment groups, unemployment rates for persons with a disability were higher than those for persons without a disability.
- In 2021, 29 percent of workers with a disability were employed part time, compared with 16 percent for those with no disability.
- A large proportion of persons with a disability—about 8 in 10—were not in the labor force in 2021, compared with about 3 in 10 of those with no disability

VR Role vs. SHN Role Comparison

Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor

- Gather contact information, open new VR cases collect necessary documents and maintain case files.
- Provide direct services to students with disabilities, developing and implementing a process that leads to a successful preparation for a planned employment outcome.
- Interact with parents and other support people.
- Develop and maintain relationships with community referral sources.
- Provide Disability Awareness Presentations.

Student HireAbility Navigators


- Locate work related services available in workforce area.
- Promote Pre-Employment Transition Services.
- Share information about and refer students and self-advocates to TWS – VRS.
- Identify gaps in services and establish successful strategies for cross agency collaboration.






