Hughs today released the following statement on the passing of Dr. James H. “Red” Duke, who was a U.S. Army veteran and has supported numerous veterans causes and workforce initiatives, including TWC’s statewide hiring fair Hiring Red, White & You!

“We were sorry to hear of the passing of Dr. Red Duke yesterday. Dr. Duke was not only a brilliant surgeon and well-known champion for health-related matters in Texas, he was also a strong advocate for veterans workforce initiatives and our partner in promoting our Hiring Red, White and You! veterans’ hiring fairs. The state of Texas lost a true Texas hero with his passing,” said TWC Chairman Andres Alcantar.
