<sup>1</sup>The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) is exercising its authority, as provided in TWC rule §800.51(f), that, notwithstanding any other provision of the rules, the level of funding allocated to a local workforce development area may be determined, modified, or reallocated by TWC's three-member Commission (Commission) to ensure full utilization of the funding and compliance with state and federal requirements applicable to the state, or to respond to unforeseen demographic changes, and, as provided in TWC rule §800.51(e), that funds available to TWC that are not otherwise allocated under this subchapter may be used for purposes authorized by state and federal laws and regulations.
