600%

Increase in fentanyl deaths in Texas in the last five years.¹

1 in 4

Texans have experienced an opioid overdose or know someone who has.¹

45%

Of all drug poisoning deaths last year were related to fentanyl.¹

Of U.S. employers report opioid use has impacted their workplace.² 1 in 10

Consecutive year in a row rise in deaths from accidental overdoses, including fentanyl.³

Naloxone can reverse a fentanyl overdose and save lives.

- If you or someone you know is at risk for opioid overdose, carry Naloxone.
- Texas organizations can request a free, standing order to distribute Naloxone.⁴
- Employers can keep Naloxone on worksites.
