

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, everyone.

This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public comment? Thank you very much. Good morning, Ms. Miller.

MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. This brings us to the end of Agenda Items 3 through 7. We'll take a short recess.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, let's get back here with Agenda Item 8, Statewide Rapid Incumbent Worker Training Pilot Initiative.

MARY YORK: Good morning, Chairman Daniel,
Commissioner Demerson, Commissioner Treviño, and Mr. Serna. For
the record, I'm Mary York with Outreach and Employer
Initiatives. Commissioners, states may currently use their
statewide Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act funds for
incumbent worker training activities. Similarly, local Workforce
Development Boards are also able to provide incumbent worker
training using formula funds through WIOA adult and WIOA
dislocated worker to serve employers in their area. To qualify
as an incumbent worker, generally the worker must have an
established employment history with the employer for six months
or more. Additionally, incumbent worker training requires other
funds to be leveraged. Before you today for your consideration

is an incumbent worker pilot initiative which would award grants to medium and large employers, a consortium of these employers or their designee for the purposes of retaining a skilled workforce for averting the need to lay off employees. The proposed statewide program would allow employers operating in multiple areas of the state to receive training for their incumbent workforce regardless of their location or the capacity of the local board to support additional incumbent worker training. The pilot would launch later this month and we anticipate an initial 60-day application period with awards ranging for 150,000 to 500,000. The initiative would allow staff to determine the demand and effectiveness for such a program at the state level. Therefore, staff recommends the commission approve up to five million dollars of Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act statewide funds to support a statewide rapid incumbent worker training pilot. This concludes my presentation and I'm happy to answer any questions that you may have.

approve up to five million of Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act funds to support a Rapid Incumbent Worker

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Training Pilot Initiative as described in the discussion paper and presented today by staff.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 9,

Suspension of 40 TAC 805.41(c).

MAHALIA BALDINI: Good morning, Chairman Daniel, Commissioner Demerson, Commissioner Treviño, and Mr. Serna. For the record, Mahalia Baldini, Workforce Development Division. The Texas Workforce Commission Chapter 805.41(c) establishes that AEL grants are limited to a maximum five-year grant term at which time the Texas Workforce Commission must conduct a new competitive statewide procurement. In August of 2022, the Office of Career, Technical, and Adult Education also known as OCTAE conducted a review of the latest adult education and literacy statewide procurement and requested significant changes due to their revised interpretation of federal statutory language. In order to appropriately respond to OCTAE's request, TWC staff have determined it will be necessary to extend the current grants to allow time to review the impact of OCTAE's request and deliver an appropriate response. Since the current grants are in the fifth and final year authorized in 805.41(c), staff are seeking a suspension of the rule to continue to serve

1	the more than 60,000 adult learners receiving AEL services by
2	extending the current grants for another year. At this time
3	staff seeks direction on the temporary suspension of 805.41(c)
4	as authorized under Chapter 800.8 until TWC can move forward
5	with a statewide procurement to award new grants. The temporary
6	suspension will provide the time necessary to assist the
7	commission in determining how best to respond to OCTAE's
8	request. This concludes my comments and I'm happy to answer any
9	questions that you may have.
