1 Tuesday, April 11, 2023 2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, everyone. 3 This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed 4 up for public comment? 5 MR. TROBMAN: No, sir. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much. Good 6 7 morning, Ms. Miller. 8 MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir. 9 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. This brings us 10 to the end of Agenda Items 3 through 7. We'll take a short 11 recess. This is Agenda Item 8, Texas Rising Star Centralized 12 Assessor Statewide Initiative. 13 REAGAN MILLER: Good morning, chairman, 14 commissioners. Reagan Miller with Child Care & Early Learning 15 Division. This morning we're bringing forward a request to 16 increase the fiscal year 23 Statewide Initiative's budget to 17 support Texas Rising Star centralized assessors. We're 18 requesting that the commission approve an additional 8.4 million 19 dollars bringing the total to 9.9 million in fiscal year 23, and 20 I'm happy to answer any questions. 21 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? 22 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None here. 23 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here. 24 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

approve increasing the amount of the CCDF funds in the fiscal year 2023 operating budget for the Texas Rising Star Centralized Assessor Initiative by 8.4 million dollars bringing the fiscal year 2023 initiative total to 9.9 million dollars as described in the discussion paper and recommended today by staff.

Williams, Workforce Development Division. This morning we are
bringing forth the final board contract year 2023 child care
local match. Boards do submit these local match pledges to
secure federal child care funds. Supporting documentation
includes two board contract year 2023 match agreements from one
board, Capital Area. Including match agreements approved
previously, the boards have secured 109.01 percent of the
statewide local match target for BCY23 with 28 boards securing
100 percent of the target. Staff recommends accepting child care
pledges, donations, transfers, and certifications of expense for
BCY23 in the amount of 1,862,463. I'm happy to answer any

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   Last Thursday the Texas House passed House Bill 1, the General
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   Appropriations Act, and Senate Bill 30, the supplemental
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   appropriations bill for the fiscal year 2022-2023 biennium. Both
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   bills will now go to the Texas Senate for their consideration,
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and the timelines for these bills to be considered on the Senate floor has not yet been announced. Tomorrow morning the Senate Natural Resources and Economic Development Committee will be considering Senate Bill 150 by Senator Springer which relates to maximum amount of unemployment benefits payable to an individual during a benefit year under the state unemployment insurance program, and Chairman Daniel will be the resource witness on that bill. Happy to answer any questions.
