

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

1 Tuesday, June 20, 2023 2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, everyone. 3 This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed 4 up for public comment? 5 MR. TROBMAN: No, sir. 6 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you, Mr. Trobman. 7 Good morning, Mr. Treadwell. 8 MR. TREADWELL: Good morning. 9 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: The motion passes with the exceptions noted. This brings us to the end of Agenda Items 3 10 11 through 7. We'll take a short recess. 12 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, we're back. 13 This is Agenda Item 9, Local Workforce Development Board 14 Nominees. 15 CHERIE DUDLEY: Good morning, chairman, 16 commissioners, and Mr. Serna. For the record, Cherie Dudley with 17 Workforce Development. Today for your consideration we have 18 Workforce Board nominations for Alamo, Heart of Texas, Greater 19 Dallas, Rural Capital Area, and Southeast Texas. Staff 20 recommends approval on the presented nominees, and I'm here to 21 answer questions you may have. 22 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions? 23 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None here. 24 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here. 25 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

1 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Mr. Chairman, I move 2 that we approve the local Workforce Development Board member 3 nominees presented today for the following offices: Workforce 4 Solutions Alamo, the Heart of Texas, Greater Dallas, Rural 5 Capital Area, and Southeast Texas. COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: I second the motion. 6 7 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 8 seconded, and vote is unanimous. Thank you. 9 CHERIE DUDLEY: Thank you. 10 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: I don't see a legislative 11 report lurking in the back. Mr. Serna, an executive director's 12 report. 13 MR. SERNA: Yes, sir, very quickly, last 14 commission meeting you had asked staff to go back and look at 15 ways to improve and shorten the amount of time it takes us to 16 develop rules. Staff has done that and we'd like to provide a 17 brief overview. If there are no questions, we're going to 18 proceed, after the overview if there no questions or anybody 19 needs further information, if any of you all do, then we will 20 certainly brief the offices and come back and finalize it but 21 with that I'm going to ask Reed O'Brien to come up and kind of 22 lay things out for us. 23 REED O'BRIEN: Good morning, chairman,

commissioners, and Mr. Serna. For the record, I'm Reed O'Brien,

Office of General Counsel. As Mr. Serna just stated, as

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requested staff have reviewed the agency's rulemaking process to identify any improvements that we could make to improve that process and make it more efficient. Staff has determined that the most significant and immediate improvements to optimize efficiency would be to remove the policy concept phase from our rulemaking process. State statute requires state agencies to publish their proposed rules and adopted rules in the Texas Register but the policy concept is something that TWC does in addition to those requirements. The policy concept is like a mini discussion paper that staff prepares and presents to seek the commission's approval to move forward with developing proposed rules. Staff has determined that while it has its merits, the policy concept phase is redundant and time consuming for staff, management, and the commission, and it adds three months to our rulemaking process. This additional time becomes especially critical when we need to implement legislation, complete rulemaking before the next legislative session begins or meet other necessary deadlines. Removing the policy concept phase would immediately cut a standard rulemaking timeline from about 10 or 11 months down to approximately seven months, and we have enough flexibility built into the process so that we could reasonably expect several rules to move from proposal to adoption in six months or even less. If the policy concept phase is eliminated, staff will continue to keep the commission informed about upcoming rule projects through the regular

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   briefing process, and please note that the elimination of the
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   policy concept phase will not affect or reduce the comment
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   period during which the public and boards can offer comments on
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   proposed rule changes. That concludes my remarks. I'm available
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   for any questions.
                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions?
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                         COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Chairman, I think
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   it's always good when we're finding efficiencies, and I
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   encourage the team to continue to do so. Cutting three months
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   off is amazing, and I think we're going to see some real good
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   progress there.

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                         COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: No comments. Thank

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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you.
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                         COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Mr. Chairman, but
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   Reed though, I've not seen Reed in quite some time.
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                         REED O'BRIEN: It's been a while.

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   to probably think about some sort of rulemaking of our own like
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   on a 12-month period or an 18-month period. We'll work on that.
