

## MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

2 | CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, everyone.

This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public comment? Thank you. Good morning, Ms. Miller.

MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. That brings us to the end of Agenda Items 1 through 8. We'll take a short recess.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, this is Agenda

Item 9, Proposed Rules for 40 TAC Chapter 800, Reporting

Workplace Violence.

Daniel, Commissioner Demerson, Commissioner Treviño, and Mr.

Serna. For the record, I'm Jon Pokorney, policy director with

Fraud Deterrence and Compliance Monitoring. Commissioners,

before you today for your consideration and approval are

proposed rule amendments to Chapter 800, General Administration,

the new Subchapter N. Last session the legislature passed and

the governor approved HB915 which added Chapter 104A to the

Labor Code and requires employers to post a notice to employees

that they can anonymously report workplace violence or

suspicious activities to DPS. HB915 also required TWC to consult

to DPS and provide the form and content of the reporting

workplace violence poster by rule no later than March 1, 2024.

We collaborated with DPS on the proposed ruling and the methods

1 of reporting. The proposed rule provides an English and Spanish 2 version of the poster as required by HB915. The proposed rule 3 also states that TWC will make the poster available for free on 4 the agency's website similar to other workplace posters. Staff 5 recommends submitting the proposed rule for publication in the 6 Texas Register for a 30-day public comment period. Staff also 7 requests the ability to make minor nonsubstantive changes to the document to comply with the publication requirements of the 8 9 Texas Register and the Office of the Secretary of State. This 10 concludes my presentation. I'm available to answer any questions 11 you may have. 12 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? 13 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None here. 14 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here. 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   Serna. For the record, Michael Britt, Governmental Relations.
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   This past Saturday the U.S. Congress passed and the president
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signed into law HR5860. This bill continues federal government funding at current levels through November 17th of this year. Regarding the state legislature, also over the weekend Governor Abbott notified the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the House that he will call the Texas legislature into special session beginning next Monday, October 9th at one o'clock in the afternoon. The governor's notice did indicate that he will issue the formal proclamation which will include the specific issues on the call sometime before next Monday. This concludes my remarks. I'm happy to answer any questions.

I visited last week-three weeks ago with the governor and others about the Texas Economic Development Corporation, a position over there, and so I'm going to actually be tendering-I have tendered a resignation effective November  $6^{\text{th}}$  with the agency and will be taking that position. I wanted to mention that here because the press release will be

coming out in that regard, and so delighted to have met with Governor Abbott and also with Vicki Hollub who is the chair of the Economic Development Board of Directors, and so will relinquish this position and assume that position as the president and CEO of that organization effective November 6th, and so appreciate the time here. We have an entire month to go through and so I have a lot of pre-committed events and activities and I want to carry those out and also to work with you guys to make sure that we're not stacking the dockets and the like, and so will carry that through November as appointments does their work as well but more to come in that regard but wanted to put that on record so that it is known from the standpoint so appreciate everything, and we'll have more to come as we lean down the line but thank you for the opportunity.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Well, congratulations. I

was on the board of directors of that organization for nearly five years. They do great work. You're an excellent choice to lead that. Good luck. It's a big job but I think you're up to the task.

COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Appreciate that.

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Congratulations. I could have read some of the motions if that would have changed your opinion but congratulations, and I wish you the best. We're going to miss you.

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   breath the commissioners say that's it, that is it. I don't know
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   what that was in reference to.

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   with that board, and I served in that position as well on the
   board and then off the board as well so looking forward to the
