

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, everyone.

This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public comment?

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much. Good morning, Ms. Miller.

MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: How are we today?

MS. MILLER: Very well, thank you.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. And that brings

us to the end of Agenda Items 1 through 8. We'll stand in a short recess.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 9, Estimated Unemployment Trust Fund Balance.

CHRIS NELSON: Good morning, chairman, commissioners, Mr. Townsend. For the record, Chris Nelson, chief financial officer. This morning for informational purposes only I have the final October 1st trust fund balance, and I'll walk through it quickly with you. We started last October 1st with a balance of 2.13 billion. We received revenue of 2.3 billion on 1.07. We paid out almost 2.3 billion in benefits during that same time period leaving an ending balance of 2.2 billion for the year. That is above the trust fund floor of 1.34 billion which alleviates any need for a deficit or obligation tax to bring the trust fund to the floor. It's also below the ceiling

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so-which is right where we want it to be. On the ETIA account,
the Employment and Training Investment Assessment, we started
the year with 112 million. We collected 135 million, removed our
collection cost out of it and since we were above the floor, we
transferred—are going to transfer 28.4 million to cover the
Skills appropriation since we were above the floor leaving an
estimated about [inaudible] 218 million as of October 1st. That's
the final balance as of October 1^{\rm st}. We just got the
comptroller's estimates. They've updated their unemployment
insurance estimates for this year and next year so looking to
bring the first October 1, 2024, balance here probably in
January. Again, this is just for informational purposes only so
that concludes my comments. I'll be happy to answer any
questions.

                     CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Are we closer to the floor
or closer to the ceiling?
                     CHRIS NELSON: We're actually closer to the
ceiling than the floor.
                     CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you.
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CHRIS NELSON: The ceiling would be about 2.6 billion so we're 400 million below the ceiling but we're roughly 900 million above the floor.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Got it, thank you. No other questions? Thank you, Chris.

CHRIS NELSON: Next item?

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Agenda Item 10,

Modifications for Program Year 2023/Fiscal 2024 Allocations and Distributions for WIOA Adult and Dislocated Workers.

Nelson, chief financial officer. This morning you have before you the Fiscal Year 2024/Program Year 2023 WIOA adult and youth allocation modifications that were previously adopted on May 23, 2023, for the contracts that started July 1, 2023. It's been discovered there was an error in the excess unemployment factor used in the adult and youth allocations that inadvertently provided Alamo Workforce area with \$147,003 of additional adult funding, and \$156,127 in additional youth funding. The modification corrects that error and redistributes the funding using the correct data factors by the counties. The net effect of the total allocation is unaffected. This just redistributes the funding the way it should have been done the first time so that concludes my remarks and I'd be happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions.

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: No questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move we adopt the proposed order modifying the Program Year 2023/Fiscal Year 2024 allocations and distributions for the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Adult and Dislocated Worker Program as recommended today by staff.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Second.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and seconded. The motion carries. This is Agenda Item 11, Redistribution of Program Year 2023-2024 Adult Education and Literacy Funds.

ERRY BALLAST: Good morning, Chairman
Daniel, Commissioner Treviño, Commissioner Esparza, and Mr.
Townsend. For the record, Kerry Ballast, Workforce Development
Division. This morning we have for your consideration a
recommendation to redistribute AEL funds. Presently we have
about 1.2 million dollars in funds available for redistribution.
Table 1 in your notebook materials outlines the proposed AEL
providers who meet criteria outlined in TWC Rule 800.80, and the
amounts associated with the redistribution of funds to each
eligible entity. Staff are also recommending additional targets
to accompany the funds as outlined in Table 2 of your notebook

materials. This concludes my remarks and I'm happy to answer any questions you have.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move we

approve the plan for redistribution of Program Year 2023-2024

Adult Education and Literacy Funds as follows: One, redistribute \$1,153,446 of recaptured funds to AEL grant recipients as shown in Table 1 of the discussion paper, and two, adjust the Program Year 2023-2024 performance targets for AEL grantees receiving redistributed funds as distributed in the discussion paper and recommended today by staff.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Second.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and seconded, and the motion carries. This is Agenda Item 12, Adult Education and Literacy Career Pathways Professional Development Center.

KERRY BALLAST: Good morning again. For the record, Kerry Ballast, Workforce Development Division. We have for your consideration a recommendation to increase the budget for the Career Pathway Professional Development Center. Staff are recommending a new request for application with a total budget of \$1,000,000 as outlined in your notebook materials.

1 This would be an increase of 250,000 above what was approved by the commission on June 13, 2023. This adjustment is in 2 3 preparation for the anticipated outcomes of the upcoming request 4 for applications which will likely result in more grant awards 5 to manage. Consequently, the AEL team has recognized the 6 necessity to increase funding for technical assistance which is 7 a required activity outlined in WIOA 223(C) that details use of 8 state leadership funds. This concludes my remarks. I'm happy to 9 answer any questions you have. 10 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions? 11 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here. 12 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions. 13 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 14 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move we 15 approve the increase in the Adult Education and Literacy Career 16 Pathways Professional Development Center funding to 1,000,000 as 17 described in the discussion paper and recommended today by 18 staff. 19 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Second. 20 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 21 seconded, and the motion carries. This is Agenda Item 13, 22 Recertification of CRPs to participate in the Purchasing from 23 People with Disabilities Program.

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1 Division. This morning we would like to consider possible action for CRPs applying for recertification to participate in the 2 3 Purchasing from People with Disabilities Program. All four CRPs 4 meet the requirements for recertification and are paying minimum 5 wage or higher. Staff recommends the recertification of the following four CRPs that are listed in the discussion paper: 6 7 Camino Real Community Services, Lytle, Texas; Permian Basin 8 Community Centers, Midland, Texas; Professional Contract 9 Services Incorporated, Austin, Texas; SDR and Associates, 10 Edgewood, Texas. That concludes my comments. Are there any 11 questions? 12 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? 13 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here. 14 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions. 15 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 16 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move that 17 we approve the recertification of the following Community 18 Rehabilitation Programs for participation in the Purchasing from 19 People with Disabilities Program as recommended today by staff: 20 Camino Real Community Services; Permian Basin Community Centers; 21 Professional Contract Services Incorporated; and SDR and 22 Associates.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I second.

For the record, Sandra Williams, 25 Workforce Development Division. Boards submit annual local match

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   pledge amounts for child care local needs. The supporting
   documents include one Board Contract Year 2024 donation and 30
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   Board Contract Year 2024 match agreements from nine boards.
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   Those boards are Central Texas, Dallas, Gulf Coast, Lower Rio,
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   North Central Texas, North Texas, Panhandle, South Plains, and
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   South Texas. Boards have secured 32.39 percent of the statewide
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   local-child care local match target with three of these nine
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   boards securing at least 100 percent of the target. Staff
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   recommends that the commissioners accept child care pledges for
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   donations, transfers, and certifications for BCY24 in the amount
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   $8,002,055. I'm happy to answer any questions.

It was a great conference. 14 MR. TOWNSEND: Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any other order of 16 business to come before the commission? 17 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Chairman, if I may. 18 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Please. 19 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I also want to 20 commend all the work that was put into that conference. It was a 21 great successful conference and we got a lot of ideas and 22 understanding from-about this agency and with momentum moving 23 forward. Internally in our office, in the employer's office, I 24 also want to introduce, we've got new staff. Veronica Rivera, we 25 have coming in. She's our executive assistant. She'll be

reaching out and I guess designated party planner for the office but she comes in from the great county of Bee County, the pride of Bee County coming right here to Austin so we're happy to have her, and we ask that Veronica just push us around as needed and make sure we're on time and on schedule. Thank you, commissioner. That's it. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: If I could ask a clarifying question, you brought in a party planner from Bee County, and you somehow think this agency's ready for that move.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Bee County loves a party.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Yeah, welcome.

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: I just also wanted to say great job to the staff for that conference. It was my first conference, and you all made it go seamlessly but especially to my team, Julia, Elena, Forrest, Rebecca, Ronnie, Jade, and Sidnee.
