

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good afternoon. This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public comment?

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you, sir. Good afternoon, Ms. Miller.

MS. MILLER: Good afternoon, sir.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. We'll take a short recess. All right, we're back. This is Agenda Item 9, Industry-Based Certification Advisory Council Inventory.

Daniel, Commissioner Treviño, Commissioner Esparza, and Mr.

Serna. For the record, Kerry Ballast, Workforce Development

Division. House Bill 3938 of the 87th Texas Legislature created
the Industry-Based Certification Advisory Council. The Council
is made up of nine individuals representing industry and public
secondary CTE programs and postsecondary CTE programs. House
Bill 3938 charges the Council with creating an inventory of
industry-recognized credentials. Today staff brings forward the
Council's inventory and an overview of the Council's process in
developing that inventory. At this time staff requests the
commission's adoption of the 2023 inventory of industryrecognized credentials.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: I move we adopt the

Industry-Based Certification Advisory Council's inventory of industry-recognized credentials and certificates pursuant to Texas Labor Code Section 312.003.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Second.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and seconded and the vote is unanimous. Thank you. This is Agenda

Item 10, WIOA Combined State Plan for program years 2024 through 2027.

JOEL MULLINS: Good afternoon, chairman, commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, I'm Joel Mullins with the Workforce Development Division. Before you today is the Combined State Plan for the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act covering program years 2024 through 2027. The plan outlines the state's four-year strategy for WIOA core programs which include WIOA Adult Dislocated Worker and Youth, the Wagner-Peyser Employment Service including the agricultural outreach plan, Adult Education and Literacy and Vocational Rehabilitation as well as one partner program, the Senior Community Service Employment Program. Today staff is seeking approval to post the WIOA Combined State Plan for program years 2024 to 2027 for a 30-day public comment period, and I'm happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I have a question.

This was a hearing meeting, an item we had heard in 11-21. This is the combined state plan. I think the chairman had some issues that he addressed were for those he raised, were those issues addressed and could you give me a high overview of the type of information that was corrected?

JOEL MULLINS: Yeah, there were a number of things in the economic and workforce analysis section. We updated some of the data so that it was more recent. There were some—just a couple of inconsistencies in a few places in how we were defining the Texas Workforce system and made sure that we got some of the terminology consistent around our Apprenticeship Texas program and [inaudible].

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I'm satisfied. No questions. Thank you very much for that response.

Joel and his team. They did go through and make some significant improvements to the report. I think it's a good starting place for us as we're kind of telling our story about how we keep Texas's economic successes going so good that it's—we actually found a couple other things when we dug into it. 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   know there's some reports on this. There's lots of opportunities
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   for us to tell our story. This is sort of how I think we come
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   together and be able to get that done so thank you. Is there a

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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 11,
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   Apprenticeship-Related Instruction Cost Study.
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KERRY BALLAST: Good afternoon,

commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, Kerry Ballast of Workforce Development Division. Per Texas Education Code Chapter 133, at least annually the commission shall prepare and submit to the Texas Workforce Investment Council also known as TWIC or to the Apprenticeship and Training Advisory Committee a report that includes an apprenticeship-related instruction cost study for the most recent fiscal year. This year the study contains new data added through House Bill 4451 in the 88th Texas Legislative Session. The data provides information on apprenticeship opportunities in the state for emerging and high-demand industries. At this time staff requests acceptance of the apprenticeship-related instruction cost study for the fiscal years 2021 and 2022 to be submitted to the Texas Workforce Investment Council. That concludes my remarks.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: None.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move that

we approve the submission of the fiscal years 2021 and 2022

Apprenticeship-Related Instruction Cost Study pursuant to the Texas Education Code Section 133.006 as recommended today by staff.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I second.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and seconded and it's unanimous. Thank you. This is Agenda Item 12, WIOA Statewide Funding for Dislocated Workers Transitioning from Fort Cavazos.

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SANDRA WILLIAMS: Good afternoon, commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, Sandra Williams, Workforce Development Division. The Central Texas Workforce Development Board was awarded a national dislocated worker grant by the U.S. Department of Labor Employment and Training or DOLETA on December 1, 2001, due to the need resulting from dislocations from Fort Cavazos. This grant ended November 30, 2023. Participants in this grant have included dislocated workers who are service members and military spouses dislocating from the Fort Cavazos U.S. military base. On August 30, 2023, the Texas Workforce Commission on behalf of the Board applied for another emergency recovery national dislocated worker grant from DOLETA to assist with this need. Staff is currently recommending providing the Board \$750,000 in additional statewide funds to the Board to provide training in these targeted occupations and support services for new and currently enrolled individuals who are transitioning or military spouses from Fort Cavazos for the period December 2023 through March 2024. I'm happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.

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                         SANDRA WILLIAMS: We are hoping to hear at
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   any point in time.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: And you said the first
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   grant was in effect from what year to what year?
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                          SANDRA WILLIAMS: 2021 to 2023.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Are they typically two-
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   year grants?
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                         SANDRA WILLIAMS: Yes.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: OK. So in the event that
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   we approve this $750,000 today, what happens if we don't get the
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   next grant? How will they-how's the Board going to continue this
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   following that if they don't get the next grant?
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                         SANDRA WILLIAMS: If they do not get the
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   grant, we will be working with the Board to see what we can do
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   to assist them. Unfortunately, many of the services may end up
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   winding down.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: OK, all right. Is there a
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   motion?
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                         COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move we
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   approve the $750,000 in additional Workforce Innovation and
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   Opportunity Act funds to be provided to the Central Texas
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Workforce Development Board for training dislocated workers transitioning from Fort Cavazos in target occupations and support services for new and currently enrolled individuals from December 2023 through March 2024 as recommended today by staff.
