## Funding for Texas Education Code Chapter 133 Apprenticeship Training Program Discussion Paper

## 3 Background

- 4 Texas Education Code (TEC) Chapter 133, Apprenticeship System of Adult Career and
- 5 Technology Education, establishes the Apprenticeship Training Program (ATP) and the criteria
- 6 by which the Texas Workforce Commission's (TWC) three-member Commission (Commission)
- 7 may award state funding to support instruction provided to pre-apprentices, apprentices, and
- 8 journey workers.
- 9 In preparation for each fiscal year (FY), the Commission, acting upon recommendations from the
- 10 Texas Workforce Investment Council, sets aside funding for the support of related technical
- 11 instruction (RTI) for apprentices.
- 12 Program funding originally began as state funding only. However, the growth of the program in
- 13 number of employers participating—a 65% increase from FY '14 to FY '23—and in the number
- of apprentices served—a 56% increase from FY '14 to FY '23—prompted the Commission to
- use other funding to maintain a consistent contact hour rate (CHR). Additional funding has
- 16 included federal funds such as those awarded through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity
- 17 Act (WIOA), the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Non-Custodial Parent program
- 18 (TANF-NCP), and, as recently as February 2024, a Department of Labor Apprenticeship
- 19 Expansion grant.
- 20 Issues
- At its April 30, 2024, meeting, the Commission provided public notice that \$4,807,247—
- 22 \$3,657,247 in General Revenue; \$1,000,000 in WIOA Statewide; and \$150,000 in TANF-
- 23 NCP—will be available for Chapter 133 ATP programs, pending approval of the FY'25
- 24 operating budget.
- At its June 7, 2024, meeting, the Commission approved the FY '25 Operating Budget, affirming the amounts listed above.
- 27 Applications for the FY '25 Chapter 133 ATP indicate the program continues to grow, and, if all
- contracts are awarded, the CHR will fall short of the desired \$4.

## 29 Decision Point

- 30 To meet a \$4 CHR for FY '25, staff recommend supplementing the approved Chapter 133 ATP
- 31 budget with the following for a total of \$2,088,527 in additional funding:
- \$500,000 in Healthcare Apprenticeships (WIOA Statewide)
- \$500,000 in Healthcare Apprenticeships (DOL grant)
- \$88,527 in Apprenticeship Expansion (DOL grant)
- \$1 million in Texas Industry Recognized Apprenticeship Grant Program
- 36 While the supplemental funding does not guarantee a \$4 CHR, staff have considered projected
- 37 growth and early calculations from the FY '25 Chapter 133 ATP applications to arrive at this
- 38 funding recommendation.
