Funding for Texas Education Code Chapter 133 Apprenticeship Training Program Discussion Paper

3 Background

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- 4 Texas Education Code (TEC) Chapter 133, Apprenticeship System of Adult Career and
- 5 Technology Education, establishes the Apprenticeship Training Program (ATP) and the criteria
- 6 by which the Texas Workforce Commission's (TWC) three-member Commission (Commission)
- 7 may award state funding to support instruction provided to pre-apprentices, apprentices, and
- 8 journey workers.
- 9 In preparation for each fiscal year (FY), the Commission, acting upon recommendations from the
- 10 Texas Workforce Investment Council, sets aside funding for the support of related technical
- instruction (RTI) for apprentices.
- 12 Program funding originally began as state funding only. However, the growth of the program in
- number of employers participating—a 65% increase from FY '14 to FY '23—and in the number
- of apprentices served—a 56% increase from FY '14 to FY '23—prompted the Commission to
- identify other funding, when available, to maintain a consistent contact hour rate (CHR).

16 Issues

- 17 At its July 2, 2024, meeting, the Commission approved use of WIOA and DOL Expansion Grant
- funds for a total of \$1,088,527 to supplement the Chapter 133 ATP CHR. At that meeting, staff
- 19 had also recommended the use of \$1M Texas Industry Recognized Apprenticeship (TIRA) Grant
- 20 Program funding for this purpose. The Commission requested staff bring forward a discussion
- 21 paper explaining its recommendation to use TIRA funding¹.
- 22 Interest in the TIRA Grant Program is grown through agency outreach. Through meeting with
- employers and understanding their workforce needs, staff has learned employers are highly
- 24 enthusiastic about the state's support of TIRA. However, some employers have been reluctant to
- 25 apply since program reimbursement can only occur at the conclusion of both the apprenticeship
- and the subsequent 12 months of employment. Of the applications currently under review, it is
- 27 anticipated that approximately \$3.7M could be awarded in contracts, leaving a carry forward of
- about \$6.2M into FY '25. The agency will address employers' concerns in its legislative
- 29 proposals for the upcoming session.

30 Decision Points

- 31 Because TIRA funding and Chapter 133 ATP funding are appropriated within budget strategy
- 32 B.1.2 Apprenticeship in the General Appropriations Act (HB 1, 88th Legislative Session,
- Regular), staff recommend use of \$1M in TIRA funding to supplement the Chapter 133 ATP
- 34 CHR for FY '25.

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¹ TWC was appropriated \$10M general review per biennium by the 88th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, to launch and award grants under the TIRA Grant Program. Details about the program are contained in <u>Texas Labor Code Chapter 302</u> and <u>Texas Administrative Code Chapter 838</u>.
